## Qualifications for Admission

Foreign students who meet all of the requirements 1 - 5 below may apply for admission.

1. 18 years old or older and have completed 12 years of primary and secondary education.
2. In principle, have either studied for six months or more at a Japanese language institute designated by the Ministry of Justice (hereinafter referred to as a "Japanese language institute") in Japan or been educated for one year or more at a school (excluding kindergarten) under Article 1 of the School Education Law (Act No. 26 of 1947) and have a good attendance record.
3. Fall under any of items (1) – (4) below.
  - (1) Passed level N2 or higher of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT)
  - (2) Scored 200 or higher in Japanese as a foreign language in the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU)
  - (3) Scored 400 or higher in the Business Japanese Proficiency Test (BJT)
  - (4) Passed our school's Japanese written examination.
4. Have a clear place of contact during the period of stay in Japan.
5. Are able to pay school and living expenses while enrolled.

## School Expense Support System

We maintain our own economic assistance system for international students who are admitted to the Yomiuri College of Medicine and Welfare or the Yomiuri College of Auto Mechanics.

### Fee/Expense Reduction for Those Admitted on Recommendation

International students studying at their own expense (self-financed international students) with a recommendation from their previous school or designated school, who apply within the period below, will have required fees/expenses payable upon entrance, reduced as follows.

Application period: < Yomiuri College of Medicine and Welfare >  
September 1 (Tuesday), 2020 – March 1 (Monday), 2021  
< Yomiuri College of Auto Mechanics >  
September 1 (Tuesday), 2020 – February 22 (Monday), 2021

Amount of reduction: 50,000 yen

### Japanese-Language Proficiency Scholarship

International students studying at their own expense (self-financed international students) who either have passed level N2 or higher of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test, or scored 200 or higher in Japanese as a foreign language in the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU), excluding students receiving a Yomiuri Education Scholarship or a Japanese Government Scholarship (Monbukagaku-sho), will have required fees/expenses reduced by means of a scholarship as follows.

Applicable to: Students who have met the above conditions prior to the end of September in the second year of their enrollment.

Method: Students who meet the requirements at the time of their application for admission will have fees/expenses for the first semester of the first year reduced by 50,000 yen. Students who meet the requirements after enrollment will have fees/expenses reduced by 50,000 yen. (Reduction will occur only one time during the student's total enrollment.)

### Special International Student Scholarship

After enrolling, if the student meets the attendance criteria below, various payments made by the student will be partially reduced by means of a scholarship. This will apply throughout the enrollment period. However, students receiving a Yomiuri Education Scholarship or a Japanese Government Scholarship (Monbukagaku-sho) are not eligible.

Eligible to apply: Registered students at the Yomiuri College of Medicine and Welfare with an attendance rate of 90% higher  
Registered students at the Yomiuri College of Auto Mechanics with an attendance rate of 95% or higher

Note: Attendance criteria apply also to the required "Japanese Class."

Scholarship: 150,000 yen (maximum; given in the second semester of the 1st year, first semester of the 2nd year, and second semester of the 2nd year)

Method: If attendance each semester meets the criteria, the fees/expenses will be reduced by 50,000 yen.

## Payments by Students

Amounts depend on the department, as shown in the table below.

Those who take the examination in or before December will pay in two installments, at the time of enrollment and by the end of February.

After the second payment, an admission permit will be issued.

Those who take the examination in January or thereafter will pay the total amount for the first semester in a lump sum.

For self-financed international students who have been admitted on recommendation, payments at the end of February will be partially reduced.

Those who have met the attendance criteria at the end of each semester will have their payments for the next semester partially reduced.

Note: For each department, the figures in the right column are the total payments after the school's expense support system has been applied.

Note: Miscellaneous expenses, textbooks, and study materials/tools are in addition to the amounts described below.

### Refunding of Payments (All Departments)

If, after the completion of school registration, a student must decline admission for unavoidable reasons, the student should submit a written statement declining admission (including the name of the department, the student's name, signature or seal, reason for declining, and date) by March 31. After the submission, payments already made (with the exception of the admission fee) will be refunded. If fees/expenses had been reduced for those admitted on recommendation, etc., only amounts after reductions (actually paid) will be refunded. The admission fee will not be refunded.

For students who had renewed their visa status on the basis of the school's admission, the refund will be made after the student returns to his or her home country. The school will not refund any payments already made if admission is declined on or after April 1, or if the student leaves school, or if an application for extension of period of stay is not approved for reasons attributable to the student him- or herself, including bad attendance, poor performance or the like at a previous school. Additional details can be obtained from each college directly.

## Miscellaneous Expenses in Addition to Other Payments by Students
